


2019 Novel Coronavirus Outbreak Information

WCCHD manages **Healthy Williamson County**, Williamson County's health and wellness coalition. We collaborate with all types of agencies to improve health in our community



68.3% of Households are Above the Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE) Threshold in Williamson County

44.6% of renters spend 30% or more of household income on rent in Williamson County

Housing Challenges in East Williamson County

- A long-standing collaboration in the emergency assistance network police, Taylor Area Ministerial Alliance, Shepherd's Heart, Salvation Army.
- Planned new housing authority buildings
- Habitat for Humanity of WC home construction history, and plans of building homes, in Taylor
- Gaps in community awareness about local resources
- Homogenous housing stock
- Increasing construction costs
- Struggling small businesses
- High commute times (as much as 2.5 hrs.) for higher wages not available in Taylor
- New groups of people are struggling financially and are not familiar with the available resources. This reduces stigma and highlights the community-wide urgency.
- Economic growth continues in Taylor
- The City of Taylor is engaged in developing an update to the 2004 comprehensive plan.







Housing Challenges in East Williamson County

- Step One Initial conversations among City staff and Ministerial Alliance about homelessness
- **Step Two -** Larger cross-sector group meeting with many more organizations
- **Step Three -** Working group met for two months for strategic planning
 - Presentation to a much larger group planned for the end of October








Housing Challenges in East Williamson County
